

Anchor links how-to

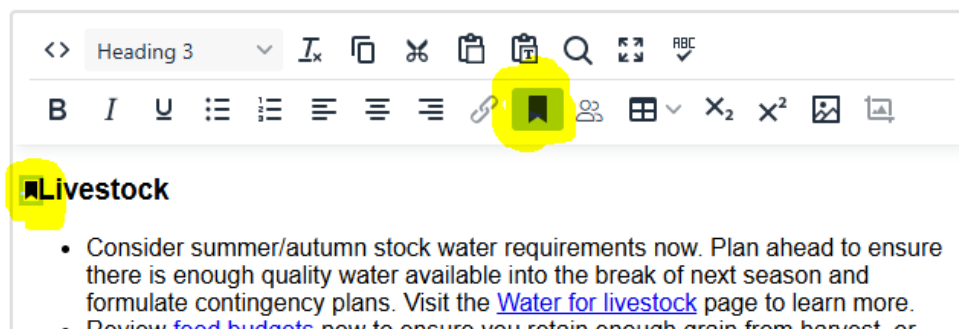
- The example below links a button at the top to a section lower down on the page.
- You can use this technique to 'jump' the user from one location to another, either within the same page or to a sub-section of another page.

Steps

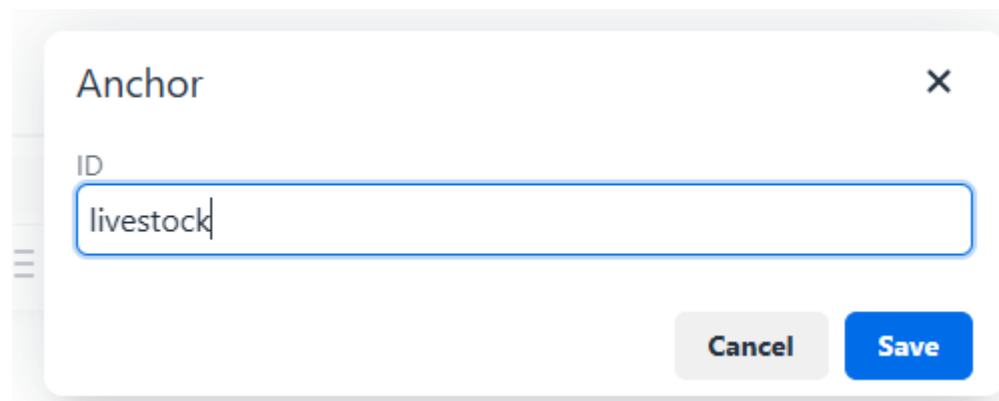
Create the anchor link

1. Decide what you want the anchor to link to. In this example, it's a heading lower down on the page.
2. Click the front of the line you want the link to go to, such as a heading.
3. Click the bookmark icon. A popup appears. Give the anchor a unique ID; in this case, it's 'livestock'.
4. Click 'Save'.

Insert the anchor link

1. Decide what people should click (button, hyperlink) to jump to the relevant section and insert the link at this location following the steps below.
2. In this example, we'll use an icon card at the top of the page.
3. Add a link to the icon card as you usually would. Choose the page where the anchor was set up, so where you're linking to.
4. At the bottom of the pop-up, fill in the 'Remaining URL' text box with the Anchor ID from earlier with '#' symbol in front. Click 'OK'.
